

These projects are revitalising the Market Quarter, creating a new Indoor Action Sports Centre and investing in the Bass House building to introduce new uses.

Taken together, these form a coherent package across Burton upon Trent town centre, bringing a diverse range of reasons to visit and attracting a number of different demographics.



DID YOU KNOW?

...this is a high value-for-money project

Our bid has an overall benefit cost ratio of 2.4:1, meaning the proposal is expected to generate £2.40 of benefit for every £1 of cost – considered in the 'high' category as an assessment of value for money.



OUTPUTS AND BENEFITS

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HEALTH AND WELLBEING

The project would create a new multi-activity leisure facility, with an indoor action sports centre featuring activities such as skateboarding, biking and parkour, and introducing a variety of other activities to meet local demand, which could include trampolining, bowling, and more.

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THE RENEWAL OF BASS HOUSE

The regeneration of this important heritage asset is a key part of our project, creating new food and drink outlets overlooking the landscaped courtyard and making it a central part of the High Street for the future.



EMPLOYMENT & TRAINING

New employment and training opportunities, including apprenticeships, will be created for residents.

LICHFIELD DISTRICT COUNCIL

Investing in the wellbeing of our community


In Lichfield, we believe Levelling Up Funding will make a huge difference to our residents' health, wellbeing and pride in where they live – by creating a brand-new leisure centre with pool, gym, community space and 3G pitch in an area with high deprivation levels with benefits for the wider population. This will replace the town's current leisure centre, which has reached the end of its life and will close fully in the near future.

Lichfield District Council has requested a Levelling Up Funding contribution of £15,773,743 to deliver a new £17,526,382 Leisure Centre which will create local jobs and provide a much-needed community space.

DID YOU KNOW?

...our new Leisure Centre will lead the way in net zero facilities

We've committed to achieving net zero carbon emissions from our operations by 2030 so this new facility will incorporate carbon reduction and energy efficiency including:

- Combined heat and power units to generate electricity from water heating
- Heat recovery units; recycling heat and humidity from extracted air
- Thermal pool covers to reduce heat loss and evaporation
- Underfloor heating
- Advanced air and water temperature management
- Renewable energy technology which may include air or ground source heat pumps, wind power, biomass or PV cells

OUTPUTS AND BENEFITS



EMPLOYMENT

New employment opportunities, including apprenticeships, will be created for residents living within a deprived area, providing accessible local jobs and upskilling as well as supporting local supply chains and providing the infrastructure to draw in new and different businesses.



IMPROVED AIR QUALITY

The location is a council-owned green space within walking distance of bus and train stops, allowing and encouraging people to utilise existing walk and cycle pathways or public transport and reducing car use.



PUBLIC REALM ENHANCEMENT

Whilst a green open space, Stychbrook Park is currently ubiquitous grassland, a surrounding hedgerow and a species-poor planted woodland belt. We'll look for opportunities to benefit wildlife and enhance people's experience of nature when visiting the leisure centre.

IMPROVED LIFE SATISFACTION

By helping to keep our residents fit and healthy and improve their physical activity we'll lower mortality risk and raise local productivity levels by reducing sickness absence – helping to boost the local economy even further.



HEALTH

Leisure provision is essential for people's wellbeing as part of their daily routine, helping those with a disability and improving mental health. The centre will also be used for local NHS rehab sessions, helping to mitigate obesity and so reduce demand on the NHS.



SOCIAL VALUE

At Lichfield District Council we apply the Principles of Social Value and Sustainability to all Procurement activity to maximise social impact. As such, we've adopted a 'Think Local' approach to attract local SME's for contract opportunities.

NEWCASTLE-UNDER-LYME

Securing the future of the heartland of ceramic creativity, AMRICC

North Staffordshire has long been regarded as the home of ceramics, not just in the UK but across the world. But that expertise goes beyond simple pottery; ceramics is a high-tech industry, with new advances and new uses for the material constantly being discovered.

We believe Levelling Up Funding would enable us to re-establish the Midlands as the go-to location for the global R&D and production of advanced ceramics. By creating a home for the Advanced Materials Research Innovation Commercialisation Centre (AMRICC), we can drive export potential and GVA growth for the UK ceramics cluster.

This advanced ceramics campus in the Ceramics Valley Enterprise Zone would be a purpose-built research building housing pilot line facilities alongside world-leading research facilities designed to scale up and accelerate research and development. As such, it will also be able to attract substantial additional private and public sector investment, currently estimated at around £65m, through the facilities on campus, the creation of further business units for the supply chain and business partners relocating adjacent to the campus.

We'll be creating one of the very few worldclass ceramics research facilities in existence, to accelerate the R&D, technology adoption Ceramics Group's (MICG) ambition of making the Midlands the centre of global R&D and production, increasing the competitiveness of the Midlands' industrial ceramics base and growing UK exports of advanced ceramics.

This funding would be an investment in...

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PARK HOUSE WEST

Funding would also be used to meet a shortfall in supply of industrial and commercial space in the Borough of Newcastle-under-Lyme. It is envisaged that these new sustainable spaces will allow businesses to stay in the Borough as they grow and create an industrial estate that has sustainability at its heart.



OUTPUTS AND BENEFITS



EMPLOYMENT

Creating a world centre for ceramics research will not only safeguard existing jobs, but create many new ones both on the campus and as businesses and organisations relocate to be adjacent to the facilities.

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IMPROVING THE LOCAL ENVIRONMENT

The project will expand the nascent AMRICC facility to create new industrial space; reclaiming brownfield land for office and industrial use.



LOCAL WELFARE

By increasing local jobs and GVA, the campus will bring many benefits to the local population, who can also be proud of having a world-leading campus on their doorsteps.



EDUCATION

The focus on R&D and delivering the MICG's vision for the Midlands as the world centre would bring curriculum development for advanced ceramics, helping to develop local talent even further.





STAFFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL

Supporting town centre transformation

The Stafford Station Gateway project will help to create a new community of up to 1,000 new homes as well as a new 80-bed hotel, 4,515 SQ M of office and retail space and a multi-storey car park, by transforming a 28ha brownfield site to the west of Stafford Railway Station. The community will also benefit from improved pedestrian and cycling access to Stafford town centre for 400+ existing homes plus around 1,500 homes at the Burleyfields development currently under construction.

The £20m of funding requested by Stafford Borough Council will allow the remediation of a significantly contaminated former factory site and demolition of an underused warehouse and office complex, in preparation to deliver the first phases of the project in anticipation of the arrival of HS2.

UNLOCKING REGENERATION

The detailed site investigations and implementation of a bespoke remediation strategy, with the demolition and land preparation, are the key to enabling the much-needed redevelopment of the Stafford Station Gateway.

MAXIMISING THE ECONOMIC **BENEFITS OF HS2**

While in Cheadle, £20m of funding would be used to create a new wellness hub on the site of the existing South Moorlands Leisure Centre which, as well as providing state-of-the-art leisure and fitness facilities, will contribute to the wider regeneration of the town.

DID YOU KNOW?

...the Gateway project will also transform further education locally

The Gateway will also become home to Newcastle and Stafford College Group's Institute of Technology, bringing employers and academia together to widen participation in targeted STEM areas. The focus will be on manufacturing and engineering across a wide range of specialisms, including the built environment, health sciences, sustainability and digital technology/innovation, and these enabling works will provide timely, marketable development opportunities.

STAFFORDSHIRE MOORLANDS

Transforming two communities

For the Staffordshire Moorlands, funding would be an investment in the pride, health and wellbeing of not one, but two of our towns.

In Leek, the £16.5m bid would enable three separate schemes to go ahead to collectively improve life for the people of this long-established market town. The first floor of the Nicholson Institute would be refurbished and repurposed to provide blended, complementary cultural and education facilities; the Trestle and Butter Markets would be given improved retail facilities and trader opportunities and the Brough Park Leisure Centre would benefit from the development of a new wellness hub.

DID YOU KNOW?

Our aim is to complement the Levelling Up Funding with further investment in people and skills via the UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF). Our plan is to spend £3.4m over the next three years, to increase life chances for everyone, to boost jobs and living standards by growing the private sector and spreading opportunities to more communities.

WELLBEING

Both projects focus on the provision of new, stateof-the-art wellness hubs to encourage local people to improve their physical wellbeing and so reduce demand on the NHS.



LOCAL CULTURE

The Leek project includes a new local centre to support local arts, cultural, heritage and creative activities.



OPPORTUNITIES

The schemes are designed to maximise the opportunities for leisure and to improve public services.



COMMUNITY PRIDE

These projects would both restore a sense of community and local pride, improving the outlook of the residents and helping them feel valued.



TOWN CENTRE IMPROVEMENT

The improvements in town centre retail and service sector infrastructure, with wrap around support for small businesses, will attract new commerce to the area and improve general prosperity for all.

TAMWORTH BOROUGH COUNCIL

Opening up the heart of our community

On the face of it, Tamworth's bid for Levelling Up Funding is about accessibility for residents and visitors. The proposal is about releasing land for development through regenerating Gungate North, connecting it with key heritage buildings and providing a new, sustainable multi-storey car park with EV charging and space for 100 bicycles. A convenience store, civic building and college building will also be created as part of the project.

But this is about much more than that. It's a vital component in unlocking other projects in the immediate area. Without this Levelling Up Funding, they are unlikely to go ahead – so our bid will literally be the key to the future of Tamworth. E26.0M project

DID YOU KNOW?

...this project will be a catalyst; kickstarting Tamworth's wider regeneration

This £26m regeneration project will put pride back into Tamworth and make it more accessible, transforming a derelict site into a reduced emissions sustainable hub. But it will also open up regeneration across a wider area, releasing a total of 6 acres of land right in the heart of the town for additional development – **£90m-worth of projects in all** – for residential and other uses, helping to diversify the town's activities to sustain it for the future. All of this will build on current transformational work carried out through the Future High Street Fund.



OUTPUTS AND BENEFITS

This funding would be an investment in...



EMPLOYMENT

This project alone would create 77 jobs, with many more following on from the wider regeneration projects.



NEW BUILDINGS

The initial project would create a new 1320sq m Civic Building, a new 419 sq m Convenience Store and a new College Building with provision for 60 high-need students. It will also unlock the further development of c. 110 homes, on a neighbouring brownfield town centre site.



IH STAFFORDSHIRE COLLEGE

IMPROVED ACCESSIBILITY

Accessibility to the town centre would be improved by the provision of a new, sustainable multi-storey car park with EV charging and space for 100 bicycles.



LOCAL PRIDE

The project would also transform the perception of local people; reassuring them that they're cared for, valued and that Tamworth is worth investing in.



A COUNTYWIDE BID TO SUSTAINABLY CONNECT PLACES

BOTH DOMESTICALLY AND NATIONALLY

This – quite literally – is where our plans and ambitions all come together. For us, Levelling Up isn't just about the revitalisation of individual town centres, but about bringing them closer – connecting them with a package of sustainable transport interventions focusing on the county's Major Road Network.
