Strong partnerships and substantial capital and revenue investment have led to significant success in developing local skills.

In 2020, one of the strongest partnerships was formed, with all of the Staffordshire and Stoke-on-Trent local authorities, Government departments, Staffordshire Chambers of Commerce and education and training providers – 29 partners in all – coming together under the **Staffordshire Countywide Employment and Skills Task Group.**

This group has led the way in implementing initiatives to plan for jobs, and working together we know we can develop the skills for higher value, better-paid jobs and a diverse, inclusive, and sustainable economy across the county.

Along with this, the **Staffordshire Partnership for Employment and Skills (SPES)** is a provider network of universities, colleges and over 30 independent training providers that supports its members to navigate the education and skills arena to deliver the skills challenges and future needs of employers across the Stoke-on-Trent and Staffordshire area.

We're united in our ambition to deliver the skills Staffordshire needs. By working together, we'll develop the skills to access higher value, better-paid jobs and deliver a diverse, inclusive, and sustainable economy across the county.



From creating new learner facilities and expanding campuses, to building one of the Country's Institute of Technologies.

STAFFORD'S SKILLS & INNOVATION HUB

An all-new facility for digital, construction, engineering and hybrid vehicle technology students.

Newcastle & Stafford Colleges Group have developed a state of the art £30m Skills & Innovation Centre at their Stafford Campus, which opened in September 2023.

The new three-storey facility has given the campus an additional 7,500 sq metres of space which is equipped with leading edge equipment to deliver state-of-the-art skills in digital, construction, engineering and hybrid vehicle technology.

The build also hosts innovatively designed social spaces, a four court sports hall, gym and a 300-seat auditorium.

NSCG Stafford was announced as one of 16 colleges in England to benefit from the Government's £1.5 billion FE Capital Transformation Fund in 2020.



BURTON INNOVATION FACILITY DEVELOPMENT

Developing immersive facilities for future learning.

Burton and South Derbyshire College (BSDC) has introduced a suite of innovative new facilities that will help further transform the future of teaching and learning.

The upgraded and revitalised facilities are being delivered after receiving £3.5 million in funding through the Stronger Towns Fund, part of a wider regeneration project across Burton upon Trent.

The new facilities include a Games Development Suite, a Cyber Security Lab, Mechatronics Lab, Health Simulation Suite, Biome (creative hybrid space), Virtual Reality Experience Centre and an Immersive Learning Suite.

The new developments will support growing and priority industries with high demand for future employment. The realistic and innovative learning environments will inspire new ways of learning, utilising the latest in new technology and industry leading equipment and partnerships. They will also offer significant opportunities to cross fertilise curriculum via technology to allow emerging sector specific skills to be delivered in line with industry requirements.

STOKE-ON-TRENT & STAFFORDSHIRE INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY

One of the Government's chosen locations for technical education.

Institutes of Technology are leaders in the provision of high-quality, higher-level technical education and training across a range of STEM occupations and industries.

The £22.5m Stoke-on-Trent and Staffordshire Institute of Technology (IoT) is a major new development based in Stafford. The IoT is one of 21 IoTs established or under development across England. Specialising in higher technical education programmes, the new employer-led Institute brings together the training offer of Newcastle and Stafford Colleges Group in collaboration with key partners to include Keele University, Burton & Derbyshire College and Axia Solutions, alongside key employer partners; Dell, Hitachi, MOOG, Siemens and St Modwen Logistics.

The IoT forms a key part of the Government's biggest shake up to technical education in a generation and will offer higher technical education programmes with clear pathways to skilled jobs in the construction, engineering, manufacturing, digital, health and life sciences, transport and logistics including specialisms in the built environment, sustainability and innovation.



THE RODBASTON GREEN VILLAGE

An integrated hub for training the next generation of agricultural mechanics, electricians, plumbers and gas fitters.

The Rodbaston Green Village will be a new training & development centre, based at the Rodbaston Campus of South Staffordshire College.

The new village will cover a range of Green Technologies that will be utilised within buildings and transportation, allowing the UK to lead on Green Technology. It will be a centre for low carbon, localised smart-energy management delivery, including electrical vehicle servicing courses, electric farm vehicle servicing and land robotics courses.

As such it will include biomass, heat pumps, EV charging installations, solar/thermal, hydrogen boilers, thermal storage and associated control systems. £1.7m Getting Building Fund will be used to create a state-of-the-art environment for world class skills delivery and a range of equipment to cover the above plus its installation and commissioning.

TAMWORTH COLLEGE'S NEW CAMPUS

A brand new college quarter in the heart of the town centre

South Staffordshire College will be relocating its Tamworth College into the heart of the town centre with a new £30m build, thanks to funding from the Department of Education and the Future High Streets Fund (FHSF) whose aim is to renew and reshape town centre high streets.

The new college will provide state-of-the-art learning spaces and include some public teaching spaces such as hair and beauty salons and catering and hospitality spaces.

Tamworth College will continue to be the place for local people to gain new skills to enable them to start their career journey, boost their career, re-train or get support to re-enter employment.

All courses on offer at the college will continue to be aligned to local and regional skills needs to ensure individuals develop skills in demand from business both locally and nationally.

NEW T LEVEL CENTRE FOR NEWCASTLE-UNDER-LYME

A dedicated new facility for technical based qualifications.

This exciting £8m scheme at the Newcastle Campus NSCG will see a two-storey, purpose built T-Level Centre opening to accommodate learners on a range of T-Level and Sport pathways. The innovative and flexible learning environment is designed to be reflective of modern workplaces and contains highly specified technology used in architecture, engineering and construction. In addition, the centre will include a brand new 4-court sports hall with capacity for an increased range of sporting activities and additional teaching spaces.

The announcement comes on the back of record student growth at the College's Knutton Lane campus, primarily driven by increased demand for new T-Level pathways that launched in September 2023.

T-Levels are a new, 2-year Level 3 qualification for 16 to 19-year-olds. Designed with employers, each T-Level is equivalent to 3 A levels and helps young people develop the knowledge, attitude and practical skills to progress into skilled employment, an apprenticeship or further study.

STOKE ON TRENT COLLEGE SKILLS HUB

Brand new facilities for the digital and creative industries.

Stoke-on-Trent College is benefiting from £14.4m capital investment to create new facilities. A brand-new building at the Cauldon campus will add to the £4m state-of the-art Digital and Creative Skills Hub. Working closely with the Digital and Creative Industries to provide first-class facilities and learning for young people and adults, including immersive classrooms offering cutting-edge digital spaces with full access to innovative technology including: Lidar screening, 3D Printing, virtual reality, motion capture, visual effects (VFX), drones and eSports labs.

The Burslem Campus will see £8m investment in new facilities with a brand-new building to further enhance the state-of-the art campus. The College has enhanced its Construction and Engineering Skills Hubs and industry standard facilities. With recent investment in digital construction and a new suite for building surveying and computer aided design it is future-proofing its curriculum and equipping young people, adults, apprentices and employers in new and green technologies for future skills.
